NK-WONDER THINKING ROU

What is this thinking routine about?

See-Think-Wonder is a thinking routine by Project Zero that has been conceptualised by Harvard Graduate School of Education. We can use this routine to help children become more curious about the world around them. At the same time, they can practise the skill of perspective taking and critical thinking.



See – What do you observe?



Think – What do you think about that?



Wonder – What does it make you wonder about?



LOOSE PARTS PLAY

What are Loose Parts?

- Simon Nicholson, an architect, came up with the "Theory of Loose Parts" that
 proposes that creativity can be enhanced by loose parts. He described loose
 parts as "variables".
- Loose parts can include natural or man-made materials, smells, gravity, sounds, music, motion, other humans, animals, plants, words, concepts and ideas anything that children can discover the world with.

Loose Parts Play invites educators to:

- Offer children the opportunity to decide what to do with loose parts.
- Support open-ended ways of tinkering that are based on the children's interests.
- Support curriculum outcomes in informal ways.




Kai Kai and Jia Jia's Emotions

LET'S PLAY!

RIVER WONDERS: SMALL WORLD PLAY

Learning Areas: Social and Emotional Development, Discovery of the World

Learning Outcomes: Children will learn how to collaborate with peers as they recreate the habitat of the giant panda using loose parts.

You will need:





Book 1: A New Home for Kai Kia & Jia Jia



Nature's loose parts (e.g. fallen leaves, twigs, seeds)



Recyclable materials

Did you know?

Pandas live in cool climate. Kai Kai and Jia Jia are suitably housed in Giant Panda Forest where the temperatures can get as low as 18 degrees Celsius. Kai Kai's and Jia Jia's home mimic their natural bamboo forest habitat in China with bamboo, shrubs, artificial trees and a flowing stream. Jia Jia enjoys climbing the trees – sometimes even bringing the bamboo up to eat.


STEP 1: SEE-THINK-WONDER

Turn to pages 14 and 15 of the book. Observe the illustrations and allow children to wonder about a giant panda's habitat.




Next, observe the two photos on the following pages with your children. Invite them to describe what they see, think or wonder about Kai Kai and his home.

Prompting Questions











STEP 2: CREATE A PANDA'S HOME



Gather children in groups of four or five to recreate a habitat for the panda plush.

Each group to work collaboratively and use loose parts to assemble one element they have observed in the habitat (E.g. soil, water, bamboo).

When your children are done, piece all the elements together to form a habitat for the panda plush.

Prompting Questions

- Which part of the structure did you help create?
- How did you feel while working on the task with your friends?
- How did you feel when your friends say no or yes to you?

STEP 3: I'M A PANDA KEEPER

Have each child take turns to be a panda keeper for the day to take care of the panda plush in the habitat.



Prompting Questions

- How do you think your panda might feel when he is well taken care of?
- Who takes care of you at home or in school? How does that make you feel?
- How do you tell if your panda is sick? How can you help?

LET'S LEARNS

THERE'S HOPE FOR THE GIANT PANDAS

Giant pandas in the wild are under threat due to habitat loss as a result of human-induced factors. Thanks to successful conservation efforts, the giant panda's conservation status has been downgraded from **endangered to vulnerable**. This means some factors threatening wild giant pandas have been removed. There are more pandas in the wild now!



Conservation projects include provision of green corridors to link the pandas' fragmented habitats, and the setting up of nature reserves for pandas.



Having pandas under human care also contributes to valuable knowledge of the species that can aid conservation initiatives in the wild.

Prompting Questions

- How do you feel about having more pandas in the wild now?
- What would happen if there were no more bamboos? Find out together!

What are threatened animals?

Threatened animals may go extinct* if we do nothing to help them. Threats faced by many animals include habitat loss and poaching. Some threatened animals include the tigers, the pangolins, the elephants, the rhinoceros and the giant panda.





Learning Areas: Social and Emotional Development, Aesthetic and Creative Expression

Learning Outcomes: Children will discover diversity amongst their friends, and also animals while creating animal costumes using loose parts.

Did you know?

Pandas have a pseudo (false) thumb on each paw. This pseudo thumb is an enlarged part of the wrist bone. At River Wonders, you can see Kai Kai or Jia Jia using their 'thumbs' to hold bamboo and fruits while eating. Le Le has also learnt to use his pseudo thumbs to explore things around him.

STEP 1: SEE-THINK-WONDER

How many new animal friends can you find in this book? Have your children identify the pages on which the animals are featured.

Prompting Questions

SEE Let's take 15 seconds to look at these animals. What animals do you see? In what ways are they different from us?

THINK What do you think they are doing? How did Kai Kai and Jia Jia help their neighbours?

WONDER I wonder how these animals move.

STEP 2: WATCH ME MOVE

Click on the pictures to watch these videos with your children. Invite your children to observe the animals' characteristics and watch how each animal moves. Have your children choose their favourite animal from the story and move like them! Have children observe their friends. Does everybody move in the same way?









STEP 3: MAKE YOUR COSTUMES

Get each child to select their favourite animal in the videos.

2

Invite children to choose the loose parts most suited to make their animal costumes.



Conduct a show-and-tell session to motivate children to bring their animal costumes to share with their friends.




Encourage children to continue and complete their costumes at home with the help of an adult.



SUPER MUM JIA JIA

<u>Prompting question</u>: How do you think Super Mum Jia Jia feels about having Le Le? Click on the photo to watch videos of them together!



- Attentive mum Jia Jia responds quickly to Le Le's call for milk even though she needs a lot of rest.
- For almost three weeks after the arrival of Le Le, Jia Jia did not eat. Jia Jia's Care Team monitored her closely and kept her hydrated with fluids.
- Jia Jia licks Le Le regularly to stimulate urination and defaecation.

Panda cubs nurse as often as **14 times a day**!

fast after giving birth, for up to a month. Mum has to stay with her cub to keep it warm until it can thermoregulate.




Kai Kai and Jia Jia's Emotions

CHOP CHOP! BANG BANG! SAW-SEE-SAW: BUILD AND PLAY

Learning Areas: Social and Emotional Development, Motor Skills Development

Learning Outcomes: Children will step into the shoes of baby panda and their peers as they work together to create a gift for the newborn panda.

You will need:

Did you know?

After years of trying, our panda pair welcomed their first-born on the morning of 14 August 2021. Baby panda Le Le was estimated to weigh 200g at birth, and in slightly over a month, it weighed 7.5 times heavier! Giant panda cubs are amongst the fastest growing mammals.

STEP 1: FURNITURE CATALOGUE

Read pages 22 to 26 of the book again. Encourage your children to list items built by Kai Kai, Jia Jia and their friends.









Prompting Questions

- What did each animal build?
- How will they use the items they built?

Focus on page 28 of the book. How do you think the baby panda will use his present?

Using the panda plush, encourage children to use their imagination to show how the panda will use his present. How do they think the panda might feel using the present?

STEP 2: BUILDER'S WORKSHOP

Let's build something as a gift for the baby panda too!

Gather children in groups of four or five. Children will work collaboratively to build one item they wish to gift the baby panda. Make available a variety of loose parts and allow children to make their choices.





Prompting Questions

- Click on the photo to watch the video of Le Le in the nursery. What do you see?
- What would Le Le need? Does he need a place to sleep, eat and/or play?
- How big should the item be? What is the size of Le Le in the video?

STEP 3: SHOW AND TELL

Organise a show-and-tell session to encourage children to share their creation with their classmates. With the panda plush, get them to share how Le Le can use their gift.

Prompting Questions


- How would Le Le use this item?
