Animals We Love:

TIGERS

Recommended for preschoolers

Let's learn more about tigers:

- Tigers are only found in Asia. They live in deciduous or tropical rainforests, grasslands and near mangrove swamps.
- Unlike most cats, tigers love water. As excellent swimmers, they readily enter water to pursue prey.
- Tigers hunt at night, with excellent eyesight that can see six times better than we do. Their black and orange striped coat allows them to camouflage in the long grasses or wooded forests.
- Tigers have soft foot pads to creep up on prey before pouncing on them. They can pounce up to 10 m. They may hide large prey in tall grass and return to feed on them over a few days.
- The last wild tiger in Singapore was shot dead in 1930 in Chua Chu Kang village. Across Asia, tigers face the threat of poaching. There are only some 3,000 tigers in the wild.

Toy for the tigers





2 or more players



STEP 1: Take a look at this picture. The tigers love to play with toys! Playing with this toy can help keep them fit as they have to climb or jump to reach it. Can you create a toy to keep the tigers fit too?

STEP 2: Visit the Zoo and observe the tigers in the exhibit. These tigers love to play! Do you notice any objects in the exhibit that they might play with?

STEP 3: Collect at least five types of natural loose parts around the tiger exhibit. Imagine you were a tiger keeper. What kind of toys would you design for the tigers to help them keep fit? You may wish to find out more about the natural behaviour of tigers in the wild to help you create a toy for the tigers in the Zoo. Use all the different types of natural loose parts you have collected.

STEP 4: Remember to return the loose parts back to nature!
